3. Midland Zone Representative Report for 2022

Good evening to our Special guests, life members, members and friends. I stand before you as the very proud zone rep of the Mighty Midland Zone. Each year as I write this report it is such a great experience to look back on all that the clubs and the riders have achieved since the last Zone AGM.

In the 2021 PCV AGM report the Midland Zone was one of 4 zones that showed increased membership compared to the previous year. This is a wonderful achievement for a small zone during the challenging times of Covid. Thank you to the club committees and to the Midland Zone executive who work hard to ensure that the pony club experience for our members is such a positive one.

Our Zone has been a forerunner in the acceptance and promotion of the Ready 2 Ride program and the inclusion of adult riding members. These membership categories serve to support what I think is the future of pony club in the Equestrian association market place and that is as the association that values the community aspect of belonging to a club, along with ongoing learning, fun, friendship and competition opportunities. Pony club is unique in offering all these opportunities in the one association and here in the Midland Zone we do this so well.

Despite the ongoing challenges, caused by COVID, of holding rallies and events in the last ¼ of 2021, MZ president Peggy Mills ran a valuable show jump course building and show jump judging workshop at Maryborough PC which was well supported and included participants from nearby Zones. Peggy also put together a wonderful 2 day Midland Zone camp at the Dunolly Adult riding grounds in April. All who attended the camp had a great time and learned a lot thanks to the skill and quality of the coaches and the varied disciplines on offer including archery, polo cross and long reining.

Covid also managed to badly impact the PCA National that were to be hosted by Victoria at Benalla meaning the Nationals became a virtual competition which was very disappointing for all involved. T didn't stop our riders from achieving great results!

Congratulations to Kian Blanchard from Charlton PC who placed second in the Junior Tetrathlon competition.

Bendigo PC rider Holi Campbell was a member of the Sub Junior Show jumping Team that placed first. Well done to Holi!

Congratulations also to Paris Fieldler from Horsham PC who placed 5th overall in Elementary dressage competition.

Iris Sudholz , also from Horsham place 5th sub junior Combined Training . It was not possible to hold a virtual horse trials competition so the event was run as Combined Training.

In December the qualifiers for the 2022 State Show Jumping and Dressage Championships were held at Mandurang Sth PC. The Zone SJ & Flat shield competition was combined with this event due to an earlier postponement because of Covid restrictions.

Bealiba PC won the SJ shield and Loddon PC won the Flat shield. Both were very well deserved results.

The New Year saw the introduction of the Just Go system which gave, and continues to give some challenges and headaches. Thanks to MZ Chief Instructor Linda Gearing for offering her assistance to club secretaries who were struggling with the system. Thanks go to Linda too for her organisation of the NCAS workshops, the games workshop and the support she offers to Midland Zone coaches and clubs in all things coaching.

In February the Midland Zone riders who qualified for the PCV State SJ & D Championships headed off to Sale for 2 days of competition.

The MZ was represented by a talented group of riders from various clubs across the zone who all did their clubs and their zone proud. The B Grade SJ team of Kian Blanchard, Ingrid Gould, Jasmyn Beasley and Holi Campbell place 3rd which was a great effort. Our grade2 Dressage team Jasmyn Beesley ,Asha Fiedler and Courtney Dickerson did an outstanding job to place first overall as the GRADE 2 Dressage Champions

Jasmyn Beesley riding Mr Jackson won the Advanced Dressage Champion, an outstanding achievement.

The long weekend in March was again the date for the Midland Zone Victorian PC Team Championships. Each year the organising committee refines the event just that bit more, resulting in great feedback from the competitors. As always special thanks g to the tireless committee who go above and beyond to make this such a great weekend for the competitors and most importantly, it's the major fund raiser for the Midland Zone

A fun day was had by all who rode at the fabulous Charlton grounds in April for the Games Flat and Musical State qualifiers. Bealiba PC riders had a great day resulting in their teams winning the pairs, the flat rides and the games. The Bealiba Brumbies games team did very well to place 4th at State with the team of 4 placing a fantastic 2nd.

The PCV State horse trials were held at the beautiful Mansfield PC grounds in May. Our mighty Midland Zone riders were out in full force with strong representation across the grades and some wonderful results.

Mandurang Sth Superstars Jasmyn Beesley, Prudence Robinson and Teaghan Stebbins rode brilliantly to on win the John Barlee Perpetual Shield and to the Mighty Midland composite club team of Mackenzie Downing, Anna Sudholz, Ingrid Gould and Iris Sudholz who placed second. Maddy Jackson and Grace Christiansen from Bealiba PC rode really well to secure 6 th place in grade 4 Interzones in a composite team with riders from Barwon Zone.

It is possible to offer and run a grade 1 event, even though it will not count as a State Qualifying event. It allows all riders the ability to be a part of a club team to compete for the zone shield, which is the main purpose of the event.

Comments from clubs – currently working towards updating xcountry courses – would not be able to offer G1 qualifier course, but could offer a competition course for G1 rider. Issues identified – zone event rotation, volunteer hours of multiple clubs in a section, competitor travel
