Thank you to outgoing Zone Chief Instructor Linda Gerring, who has held the role of MZ Chief Instructor since 2020, and to the members of the DCI/ZA Panel for facilitating all things coaching in the Midland Zone over the last 12 months.

Your commitment to coaching is greatly appreciated.

A warm welcome to Kylie Janestki, who nominated for the role of Midland Zone Chief Instructor for 2024–25.

Kylie brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the role, having ridden Grand Prix dressage along with her years of pony club experience as a riding member, as a DC, and as the mother of two very skilled equestrians, Paris and Asha Fielder.

This is my last report as President of the Mighty Midland Zone, as I am stepping away from Pony Club to explore other volunteer options.

My involvement with the Mighty Midland Zone has brought me so much joy over the last decade, with supporting our riders at many state events being a huge highlight.

Hosting the 2024 State Showjumping and Dressage Championships at Elmore during the last weekend in February was the icing on the cake.

The goal of the event committee was to host the best state event in the history of PCV, an event that would live forever in the memories of all who attended.

With the help and support of the members of the clubs of the Mighty Midland Zone, I am confident we achieved that goal. Grateful thanks to Dylan Mealmaker, who stayed on as Junior Vice President until the conclusion of the Championships to facilitate risk analysis for the event. Dylan's expertise in that role is unsurpassed, meaning we were all in very good hands.

I joined the State Council at the end of 2014, just as the push for governance change began. The new constitution was voted in by the members in 2019, supposedly as the way forward for Pony Club.

A skill-based board was going to support the members of Pony Club to a brighter future and a better experience for all members.

I am sorry to say that the current board, in my opinion, has not met those expectations, and this causes me grave concerns for the future of PCV.

My concerns include, but are not limited to, the fact that there is no regular communication from the current PCV Board.

They have not had a current strategic plan since the end of 2022 so what are they measuring their decisions against? In fact, are they making strategic decisions? What are they doing about membership attrition, and retention?

PCV is currently without a general manager and has been for at least the last month. It is a rudderless ship. I could go on, but negativity is not what tonight is about.

However, I do believe questions need to be asked of the board, as the members of this wonderful association deserve better.

In closing, I congratulate the incoming executive committee. Thank you, Kaye Blanchard, for your faith in me when you asked me to take on the role of Midland Zone Representative in 2014.

I will forever value the friendships I have made over the last 10 years, and I am so grateful for all I have learned and for the opportunity to support the members of this wonderful Zone.

3. Midland Zone Representative Report

My tenure began during an especially busy period, coinciding with our zone's responsibility for hosting the State Dressage and Showjumping Championships in February. Their meticulous planning laid the foundation for a weekend filled with competition and camaraderie. 5. Midland Zone Examining Secretary Report

Over the past 12 months we have had successful C and C Star candidates within our Zone. In total, we have had 21 members successfully complete their C certificate over the past 12 months, in addition we have had 2 riders complete their c* certificate. Thanks to Bealiba Pony Club for hosting certificate assessments. It's great to see clubs welcoming others and building the connections and community within the zone.

The next round of C certificates will open in September with the assessment in October. I would like to encourage all clubs to be building certificate work into their rallies regularly and encouraging all coaches to be referring and linking to it in all disciplines. This aspect of the syllabus has now been in place for a while but assess are finding riders are still unsure.

I also want to let DC's who may be on the newer side to their role, that while the C certificate does have a set format there are always ways to accommodate riders with different needs. Riders who may have physical or intellectual needs that don't suit the standard format, we have ways to work around this. Please contact me in advance so that we can make a plan to suit each rider's needs. This also applies to lower-level certificates. Support can be given to clubs with alternative assessment methods where needed.

If anyone is unsure of how to go forward with this, please reach out to me.
